This choir has received numerous invitations to perform at a range of community events throughout Christchurch.

The Friendship Choir meets on Mondays from 1:15pm to 2:40pm at St Mark's Opawa Road (except first Monday of the month) **Six years ago** the Trust set up a second choir which meets twice a month on a Tuesday Evening.
